Soyo's Time

In 1917, the war to end all wars was still raging. Some 20 million military personnel and civilians would eventually perish during World War I. Converse All Star "Chuck Taylor" basketball shoes were first produced.

The Original Dixieland Jass* Band, a group of all Caucasian musicians, recorded the first jazz record. The 1918 influenza was just a year away and was perhaps the deadliest in history. One-third of the world's population was infected and 20 to 50 million people died worldwide.

In 1917, Soyo Okazawa Takahashi, a member of this church, was born in Palo Alto, CA., on January 19. After birth her father came to pick her up in a horse and buggy.

On Wednesday, June 9, she died in El Cerrito, at 104 years old.

Takahashi attended the earliest version of Aldersgate, the Japanese Methodist Episcopal Church, then located on Ramona Street in Palo Alto. She grew up in a two to three block radius of mostly Japanese Isseis and soon to come Niseis. There was the Yamamura and Sato grocery stores, the Stanford Laundry, run by Josaburo Okada, and a boarding house, the Okazawa University Hotel, which belonged to her parents.

She went for rides on motorcycles driven by her neighbors, participated in the church youth group and was taken to Manzanar during World War II. She married Kazuyuki Takahashi, raised three children and later worked as an antique dealer in Berkeley for some 20 years.

"Soyo lived her life with dignity, tolerance and kindness, accepting life lessons with grace," said friend Pam Hashimoto.

The Aldersgate Church history book could not have been produced with her input.

Among the earliest of Paly Japanese Nisei pioneers, Takahashi fulfilled the dreams of her Issei parents, and it's up to us, to make sure those dreams continue. The next time you drive through Palo Alto and pass by Ramona Street, think of her. May God bless Soyo Takahashi.
